Review of the Rate Structure for Drinking Water, Sanitary and Storm Water Services

The City is reviewing the method used to recover costs for the delivery of drinking water, sanitary and storm water services. Three options are being tabled on June 23, 2009 at Planning & Environment Committee, and will undergo public review until the end of September 2009. **The proposed changes have the potential to affect all landowners in the City.**

Currently, customers pay a fixed amount for every cubic metre of drinking water consumed (\$1.264/m³); and pay a 100 per cent surcharge for sanitary and storm water services. In addition, a fire service charge is levied based upon water meter size.

All three of the rate structures options include the following changes:

The water rate and the sewer rate will differ according to the actual costs incurred to deliver those services (i.e. the sewer rate would no longer be a 100 per cent surcharge applied to the water rate.)

A new "base charge" would be introduced for water and sewer services that would vary according to meter size. The purpose of the base charge is to recover service costs that are not related to the amount of water a customer uses, for example meter reading and billing services. The fire service charge would be included in the new base charge.

The key difference between the three options is how storm water costs are recovered, as follows:

- Option A** Storm water costs would continue to be recovered as part of the sewer charge on the Water & Sewer Bill.
- Option B** Storm water costs would be recovered on a citywide basis via property taxes.
- Option C** Those connected to a municipal water supply would continue to pay storm water costs on their Water & Sewer Bill; those on private water supplies would pay for storm water costs via their property taxes.

All three options will help to improve revenue stability, rate transparency and fairness, and rate stability.



Hospital Link / Cumberland Transitway Connection Study

Notice of Public Open House #2 / Pre-Consultation

The City of Ottawa has initiated its pre-consultation / initial planning process for the upcoming Environmental Assessment (EA) Study for the proposed transit links that would connect the Southeast Transitway, the future Cumberland Transitway and Blair Station. This project is being undertaken to improve transit service to the Ottawa Health Sciences Centre and hospital lands; improve transit service from Ottawa's east end to central Ottawa; and, address existing and future development issues.



The formal EA process commences in July 2009. At that time, a Notice of EA Study Commencement will be issued. This EA Study will be undertaken in accordance with the new Ontario Transit Regulation 231/08 under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

Public participation will form an integral part of the study. The second Public Open House has been arranged to present an update on the study progress and to provide the evaluation of Alternative Design Concepts. The Public Open House is being held on:


This Open House is the second of two (2) Public Open Houses to be held for this assignment and will present the technically preferred alternative for the widening of Trim Road and obtain public comments.

**Public Open House
 West Transitway Extension
 Bayshore Station to Moodie Drive**

In November 2008, Ottawa City Council approved its long-range Transportation Master Plan, which identified the construction of the West Transitway from Bayshore Station to Moodie Drive as a priority project required to address significant current transit operational concerns in the west urban community. In order to take advantage of near term federal and provincial funding opportunities, the City has initiated a study to complete all outstanding planning and design work for this facility.

This project is being planned in accordance with the province's Transit Projects Assessment Process (Ontario Regulation 231/08). This process requires the consideration of alternative designs, public and agency consultation, an assessment of potential environmental effects, the identification of mitigation measures and the preparation of an Environmental Project Report.

In order to engage the public and obtain feedback into the planning and design for this facility, a consultation program has been developed that includes three public open houses. At this first open house, members of the public will be presented with the following information:

- Project history and background;
- The new Transit Projects Assessment Process;
- Existing conditions in the study area;
- The analysis and evaluation of alternative corridors;
- Further opportunities for public participation; and
- Next steps.

Representatives from the City of Ottawa and the consulting team will be available at the open house to discuss the project, answer any questions and receive public feedback on any aspect of the study.

Notice of Pesticide Use

Between June 15 and October 15, 2009, the City of Ottawa will be conducting a larviciding program under the authority of the local Medical Officer of Health to control larval mosquitoes in order to prevent their development into vectors of West Nile Virus.

Altosid pellets (PCP No. 21809) will be placed into catch basins of storm drains within the city. Vectobac 1200L (Bti) (PCP No. 21062) and Vectobac 200G (EPA 18158) will be applied to ditches, temporary or permanent pools (including storm water management ponds) within the city. Vectolex CG (PCP 28008) will be applied to surface waters at the wastewater treatment plant. All larvicides will be applied by Ministry of the Environment licensed applicators or trained technicians. The 2009 larviciding program is similar to the 2008 larviciding program. *For details on the exact locations and dates of treatment, please call Ottawa Public Health at (613) 580-6744 or 1-800-261-9799.
